


STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS


DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE







ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Northeast Ohio College Preparatory School is undergoing remarkable academic recovery since the pandemic. The school increased its Performance Index (PI) score by over 8% for the second year in a row. 100% of third graders met the reading requirements for promotion to Grade 4. NEO additionally met state expectations for student academic growth (3 Stars, Progress) and for met expectations for closing educational gaps (3 Stars, Gap Closing).

YOY PERFORMANCE INDEX SCORE




PROGRESS COMPONENT RATINGS BY SUBJECT & GRADE LEVEL



AVERAGE ANNUAL GROWTH IN READING & MATH


i-Ready Assessment, Fall 2022 to Spring 2023





NEO College Preparatory School celebrated its Class of 2023 on May 26th during a 6:30pm commencement ceremony held at Near West Theatre. Valedictorian Anyla Jones and Salutatorian Milagros Redondo were honored during the ceremony that featured a spoken word performance from senior Antwone Barbour. NEO alumna Nicole Williams shared advice about life after high school. Educator, minister, and community leader Teresa Sayles delivered the keynote address where she offered words of support and wisdom for graduates. The future looks bright for NEO seniors who earned a total of \$865k in scholarship funds and counting. At time of publication 20 seniors have been awarded full scholarships through the Say Yes to Cleveland program. All together, seniors were accepted to a total of 22 colleges and universities, including five Historically Black Colleges and Universities. Additionally, all students were accepted to Cuyahoga Community College.
